Dear Friends

As per WHO report at least 400 million people do not have access to one or more essential health services and 6% of people in low- and middle-income countries are tipped into or pushed further into extreme poverty because of health spending. In Odisha the situation is still worse. The Total Fertility Rate of the State is 2.3. The Infant Mortality Rate is 65 (UNICEF) and Maternal Mortality Ratio is 275 (ASH 2011) which are much higher than the National average. Crude death rate is 10.6 and the national average is 7.2 (UNICEF). The Sex Ratio in the State is 978 and is coming down every year. In some of the districts like Kendrapara, Ganjam, Nayagarh, Dhenkanal it is disturbing.

But without losing hope we must try our level best to bring the desirable changes in the health scenario of Odisha. Here I would like to quote the sentence of **Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam**, the 11th President of India **“Without your involvement you cannot succeed. With your involvement you cannot fail”**.

I feel extremely happy to mention here that all the staff of OVHA are always sincere and give their best effort towards the progress of OVHA. As a part and parcel of the OVHA family my sincere gratitude to all the staff along with the member organisations of OVHA for their year long continuous support. Reaching to the unreached has always been the prime concern of OVHA since its inception. The Annual Report 2014- 15 provides a glimpse of the processes to achieve this objective.

OVHA AT A GLANCE

INTRODUCTION

Orissa Voluntary Health Association (OVHA) has completed 40 years of service by 2014. It is a matter of great pleasure and honour for OVHA and its member organisation for their commitment and contribution in the field of health and allied fields. Member organisations are proud to be a part of the Oldest & Largest network of voluntary organisations working in the field of health in Odisha. We all are working together to improve the health indicators of our state. The task is gigantic. But we all as a committed group will carry forward our mission to see a better & just society where all have accessible to health facilities in and around their habitat.

OVHA as an association is committed to make health a reality. To achieve this goal the association has not left any stone unturned. Starting from awareness generation, capacity building of service providers and distribution of IEC materials at all levels by direct intervention or facilitate the member organisation to carry out the activities. A special attention is given on spatial distribution of work. The association ensures quality intervention. In some cases the association also carries out the pilot projects to show it as models. Our initiation is a tiny drop of water in the ocean of development. But we try to leave our imprint through our activities, which can be implemented and replicated elsewhere. We were working, are working and will be working to achieve our predefined goal.

VISION

People of the state would be able to live a health and peaceful life that would base on 'growth with justice'. - iv. To Affiliate with other like minded organisations;
- v. To Collect, exchange and disseminate health information as well as to do research;
- vi. To Conduct training programmes, seminars, workshops, conferences etc. related to health and development work; ment work;
- vii. To Promote rational drug therapy;
- viii. To Promote alternative system of health care;

- ix. To Promote working with committed, dedicated, and interested people of good will of all religions and communities;
- x. To Promote educational understanding in communities to improve the quality of their lives
by development of local human and material resources;
- xi. To Promote school health programme;
- xii. To Present voluntary health services in different states, national and international level;
- xiii. To promote collective action for community health and development;
- xiv. To Undertake any other act, which will promote health status of the state.

is a Ex-Officio member of the GB. The Governing Body elects the office bearers and looks after

the activities of OVHA, which is executed by the Executive Director. Executive Director is one of the key pin of the organisation and establish link between management and staff.


MEMBERSHIP

OVHA has two types of members like organisation members and associate members. A structured application form has been developed in due consultation with its members for membership of OVHA. After proper scrutiny of the documents and field appraisal, the Governing Body recommends the name of the applicant organisations to General Body for induction in to OVHA as a member. In case of Associate members, individuals of reputation and expertise in the field of health and development are inducted as associate member of OVHA. The Annual membership fee is Rs.200/- for both categories. However, organisation members those who have completed three successful years of membership can also become Life Member by paying Rs.5,000/- only.

STRUCTURE OF OVHA

OVHA has two types of members; organisation members and Associate members. Together they form the General Body - the highest decision making body of the organisation. The General Body members are eligible to cast their vote as secret ballot to elect 11 Governing Body members. The Executive Director

PROJECT SURAKHYA PLUS

Project Surakhya PLUS sprouted from the ground level reality that vulnerable and hard-to-reach communities have relatively limited access to health care services, information communication and other basic facilities and as a result they are the worst sufferers. The programme was implemented by OVHA

with the support of Medecins du Monde- France (MdM-F).

Our area of intervention: in the 6 GPs of Thuamul Rampur Block of Kalahandi District of Odisha :Adri, Maligaon, Padepadar, Talanagi, Mahulpatna and Gopinathpur.




Good service removes all the hurdles:

20 years old Jasoda Gopal reached at PHC (N) Adri along with her husband at 1.30 pm. She was suffering from cerebral malaria. Immediately Dr. Madhuri Singh admitted her in the PHC and started her treatment. In between her husband explained they have two children and they live in Dungeshkhal village in Rayagada district. They left home at 7 am and after crossing three mountains they reached at the PHC (N) Adri. The Project Manager Dr. D.K.Samal asked since they do not belong to Kalahandi district, then from where they came to know about this PHC. He replied they have relative in the Badbafla village of Gopinathpur GP and from them they learnt about the treatment facilities available at the PHC (N) Adri, where along with the doctor others stay for 24 hours.



CHAPTER II

PHC (N) ADRI

Public private partnership (PPP) has emerged as one of the important strategies for health sector reform in Odisha. Initiatives have been taken by National Rural Health Mission, Health and Family Welfare Department, Government of Odisha to undertake different PPPs in meeting the growing needs for health services and other national health programmes. With the support of the state government , OVHA is managing the Adri PHC (N) under Public Private Partnership.


Achievements:

Provision of medical care:

With an existing team of doctor, paramedics, health volunteers the project is able to provide preventive, curative and promotive health services. The OPD is functioning 24X 7 hours with alternative support of the Allopathic doctor, Ayurvedic doctor and other paramedics. Every day more than 40 patients from nearby villages are visiting to this health unit for treatment.

Providing basic laboratory services

In the PHC we have examined 1613 numbers of slides for malaria. We also used RDK.



Referral Services:

We have a bolero which is branded as ambulance and it being used to carry patients to CHC Thuamul Rampur and DHH, Bhawanipatna carry critical patients. The number of patients referred from our PHC run as follows:

Monthly Review Meeting:

Implementation of different programmes and conducting all activities without proper review does not mean sense. In order to streamline different activities and to know the outcome of all such programmes and what are the bottle necks if any etc. we conducted regular monthly review meeting of all the PHC staff where each worker's activities of the last month was examined minutely and after analysis necessary guidance was given to prepare the next month's action plan. The review meetings provided ample opportunity to everyone to learn from each one's failure or success. The minute is being recorded in the register.



RCH Mela:

In the RCH Melas which was organized in Badabafra Village in Gop[inathpur GP area around 223 patients were treated. Health education on prevention of Malaria and personal hygiene was imparted in the community meeting that was held prior to starting of camp.



Outreach Health Camps

An outreach camp in Khamarpadar village of Padepadar GP was organized which is a hard to reach area on 28th of January 2015. 240 patients from various villages under the PHC New Adri attended the Mela and availed free medical treatment.



Orientation to Quacks / Religious Healers

On dated 6th February 2015 one training programme was conducted by OVHA with the support of NHM under PHC New Adri at the same PHC to orient the quack / religious healers otherwise known as traditional practitioners on the primary health care services.


The main objective of such orientation programme was:

- Medicines should be provided as per the required doze
- Active referral
- Early referral of pregnant mothers
- People from various villages under the PHC New Adri attended the training programme.

In this programme Dr Madhuri Singh, Medical Officer, PHC(N) Adri and Dr. Dilip Kumar Samal, Executive Director, OVHA remained present and imparted training.

IEC /BCC activities:

To promote key health messages to every nook and corner of our operational area we focused on wall paintings. These paintings contain pictorial and written messages to reach every category of people. The areas were selected where peoples' approaches are frequent and can be clearly visible.



CHAPTER III

POOREST AREA CIVIL SOCIETY PROGRAMME (PACS)

The Poorest Areas Civil Society (PACS) Programme is an ongoing project of Orissa Voluntary Health Association which started in September, 2011. The basic objective of the programme is Health for All without any discrimination.

The vulnerable groups those who are falling to excluded category are to be empowered to raise their voice for their rights. "Our Voice, Our Rights" is the main motto of this programme. There are 4 distinct outputs of this programme. They are formation of groups & being their capacity. Second is to include the excluded groups into the CBOs. The third is Advocacy with the service providers and the final One is to disseminate & share success model with the community.



To achieve this in the Calendar Year 2014, 60 nos. of Planning & Review Meetings, 40 nos. of Social Audits, 20 nos. of Jana Sambads & 10 nos. of Media Advocacy Programmes were held in different locations of 5 Districts.



The Community Based Monitoring Tools which was being developed for this programme is an action oriented programme. Here the different health indicators are jointly mapped by the service providers & the community to find out the weakness of the system & how to improvise it. This year was a successful year to benefit the community by providing good results.

This programme is being implemented in 5 districts covering 13 blocks, 33 GPs in 210 villages through our four partners. The Districts are Malkangiri, Nuapada, Sambalpur, Jharsuguda and Deogarh.

In Malkangiri, our partner NGO "POPULAR" is implementing this project in one block covering 30 villages. Because of the best efforts put by our partner, the then Collector Mr Balawant Sing, I.A.S. was pleased to provide a govt. quarter in Padmagiri P.H.C. where we are having our field office. The organization was also assigned the job of monitoring and supervision of ICDS programme. The programme officer of State PACS office had visited the field and expressed his happiness about the outcome of the programme by witnessing the CBO members strength in monitoring the Angan Wadi Centre. Recently, the Chief Functionary of "POPULAR" was assigned as the



Chairman of District Child Protection Committee.

The next district is Nuapada where “SRUSTI” is our implementing partner. There are 30 villages of Komna block in the operational area. Under the leadership of Mr Biswajit Padhi , the DAC Mr Pabitra Pradhan was able to create good rapport with the district health administration. In the other hand, they have created powerful committee to file RTI for any discrepancies. A nos. of very strong group of CBOs have emerged in that location to raise their voices against their rights.

In Sambalpur , ‘Jana Kalyan Pratisthan ‘ is our partner and in five blocks they are covering 60 villages. Sixty numbers Kishori Mandal/SHGs are their output. The organization is very strong in maintaining the theme of the programme. All the PACS staffs are women and there is absolutely no roll out in the staffs. Maintaining the staffs from excluded community is a very strong point of the organization.

Similarly “Life Academy for Vocational Studies (LAVS)” is our implanting partner at Jharsuguda. The organization has a very good rapport with the district health Administration. The staff turnover during the project period is nil. This indicates that the field coverage is very effective.



CHAPTER IV

HEALTH CARE CENTRE

The Niladri Vihar slum cluster with around 16 slums in total is having a population of 27000. Most of these 7500 households, the single earning member of the family is a daily wager and earns Rs 3000.00 in a month and spends for five members of his family. Most of his earning is spent on food. For education & health, they do not have any money left over.

The Government health facility is around 12 KMs away from this area. The better off people living in this area can afford to get the private health services being provide by the private service providers. But the poor does not have any access at the time of need. They ignore the health problem initially and when it goes acute, they remain helpless and leave it to God.

OVHA with the support of BASAID Switzerland & Swiss Heidi Foundation (SHF) has constructed a Health Care Centre at Panda Park basti. By constructing a building and equipping it with instruments to render effective

health services to the slum dwellers in their need thus saving them from dangerous situation. OVHA's doctor can aware, treat and refer so that promotive, preventive and curative measures can be taken for slum dwellers. The ground floor is to be utilised for the OPD purpose where as the first floor will be utilised for the slum meeting as well as it can be used for Anganwadi centre i.e. Pre -school children education center. In the evening it can also be used for the study centre for the high school going students of the slum. This building was dedicated to the slum dwellers by Mr. Priyadarshi Mishra, Honourable MLA, Bhubaneswar (North) in presence of Honourable Mayor Sri Ananta Narayan Jena, Mr. Alok Mukhopadhyay, CEO VHAI, Mrs. Manasi Das and Mr. Sasank Mohanty of SHF and Governing Body of OVHA.

Achievements:

Till date 3225 numbers of patients treated




CHAPTER V

REDUCTION OF MALNOURISHED CHILDREN BY STRENGTHENING OF VILLAGE HEALTH AND NUTRITION DAY (VHND)

With the support of Avantha Foundation OVHA is working in the six GPs (Adri, Gopinathpur, Talanagi, Mahulpatna, Maligaon & Padepadar) of Thuamul Rampur Block of Kalahandi district with an objective of reduction of malnourished children in those areas at the end of two years of project period.

Activities

- ◆ Identification and regular follow up of malnourished children
- ◆ Sensitizing the mothers focusing on cause and effect of malnourishment on children.
- ◆ Capacity building of ASHAs and AWWs.
- ◆ Strengthening the community monitoring system by sensitizing the members of the Rogi Kalyan Samiti and Gaon Kalyan Samiti
- ◆ Establishment of referral system and ambulance service
- ◆ Provision of medical care
- ◆ Establishing linkage with Government Programmes



CHAPTER VI

SMILE-TWIN-e-LEARNING PROJECT

Objective:

Changing lives of urban-poor (adolescent youths) who belong to under privileged category of the society. OVHA has taken the opportunity to work with the youths who are educated up to +2 and extended support to them so that they can continue their education. This scope brings smile on the face of the youths once more. They are given the required education as per need of time like computer, spoken English, basic management, retail management and other education on HIV/AIDS. This type of education has not only helped the youths to get jobs but also improved their capacity for negotiation.



Target groups:

- ◆ Any urban disadvantaged youth (under the age of 21 and over 14) with either formal or non-formal education providing that they have to pass the interview test
- ◆ This includes especially women in reproductive age group, adolescents (girls & boys) of the general population.



Smile-Twin-e-Learning Project brought smile on the face of SONALI



Sonali Panigrahi belongs to a poor family of Hirapur village. She lives with her parents, two sisters and two brothers. Her father is a daily wage labourer and mother is a housewife. The family's poor economic status created harassment to her. Sonali needed a service badly. Her home is 4 km away from the study centre. One day she heard from her friend about the free education facility of IT & MANAGEMENT TRAINING and joined OVHA STUDY CENTER(e-learning training centre) supported by Smile Foundation, New Delhi. She worked hard and attended the training sincerely. After completion of her study, she appeared an interview in an English Medium School, in which she was selected. She is currently working as the teacher cum data entry operator in that school and getting a salary of 4000/ (four thousand) per month. She is very happy that she could able to reduce the burden of her father to a great extent. She is also saving some amount of her salary for her future life. She expresses her gratitude to OVHA and Smile Foundation for helping her to make her dream come true.

CHAPTER VII

SHAKTI VARTA PROGRAMME

Shakti Varta Programme - Participatory Learning and Action (PLA) model with SHGs was implemented in the 5 blocks of Nuapada District. For this the United Kingdom's Department for International Development (DFID) is providing financial and technical support to the Government of Odisha to improve the health and nutrition outcomes of the state through its Odisha Health and Nutrition Support Programme (OHNSP).

Objective:

- i. Empower women and communities;
- ii. Increase awareness of positive HNWASH practices;
- iii. Strengthen the delivery of community level services;
- iv. Build the capacity of communities and citizens and local stakeholders to increase accountability and responsiveness of local service provision to communities

This programme is executed by OVHA with its member organisation SRUSTI in Nuapada.



CHAPTER VIII

MAS

Mahila Arogya Samiti (MAS) is a forum of Women Group of the slum who desire to contribute to well-being of the community with a sense of social commitment and leadership skill to look after their health and its determinants in holistic manner. Mahila Arogya Samiti in urban areas especially at slum level is envisaged as a broader framework of

- ◆ Community mobilization
- ◆ Demand generation at the community level



Role & Responsibilities of MAS & its office bearers

- ◆ Act as community peer group.
- ◆ To identify health, water, sanitation and nutrition related issues/problems in their slums and discuss the same with frontline workers, members of WKS, facilitating NGOs etc
- ◆ Create awareness and generate demand in slum on MNCHN, WASH and other health Mobilize community for attending outreach camps, UHND sessions, RI sessions, etc.
- ◆ Help in identifying left out cases for immunization/UHND and in preparation of the due list for immunization.
- ◆ Track pregnant and infants
- ◆ Participate in Ward Kalyan Samiti (WKS) meetings
- ◆ Help WKS in preparation of ward level plan
- ◆ Participate and mobilize others to participate in observations of important days.
- ◆ Help frontline workers, member of WKS, facilitating NGOs to do the sanitary survey of drinking water source in their respective area

Achievements:

OVHA with the support of NHM has formed and strengthened 81 numbers of MAS in 54 slums.
70 numbers of bank accounts opened

SOVA, Dhenkanal

SOVA is a multi-disciplinary and National Awardee NGO located in Dhenkanal where in Sirimula it manages one PHC (New) in the remote area. It is also running one Mobile Health Unit. SOVA addressed three basic needs of the community of Mahuladagara village i.e., electrification, drinking water and freeing them from exhaustive cooking methods. After two years of intervention now the village has a street light (solar power), each household with solar lanterns and each household with smokeless chullahs.



The Director of SOVA Mr. Udayendu Mishra was felicitated with the prestigious District Level “Pratiba Samman”.

LIFE, Gajapati

Literacy Improvement and Fine Environment (LIFE) has its registered office at Parlakhemundi in Gajapati district.

Achievements:

- ◆ Counseling given to expectant and lactating mothers in 9 villages of Gosani block on various aspects such as ANC, PNC, nutrition, hygiene, sanitation, feeding techniques, etc
- ◆ Plantation programme were undertaken in 7 villages covering under Nuagada Block covering 100 acres of waste land with 107 beneficiaries to enhance alternative livelihood for the target tribal population through orchard model
- ◆ 9 nos. of grass root level users' groups were formed and were provided training on orchard development, group cohesion, income generating activities, mobilization of resources from various line departments to augment their income levels


