Children and adolescents living in the street, slums and homeless, become particularly vulnerable to substance use in such high risk circumstances. Also, the rate of help seeking behavior is low due to many factors like lack of family and community support compared to others. It is always better to intervene before they initiate the substance use behavior. Ensuring active participation of young people, they may be empowered to prevent and disseminate information on substance use prevention.

For this purpose, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt of India has introduced Community Based Peer Led intervention which would be appropriate for preventing and reducing the substance use among the young people. This is the one of strategy where young people learn from each other and support themselves.

The distinct advantages of CPLI are preventive information is easily acceptable to the target group since their "peers" are giving them the messages. Targeting the vulnerable children/adolescents will help to delay/ prevent/ reduce substance use in the community. It is also fast to multiply the beneficiaries thus more beneficiaries could be reached out with relatively less resources. Hence it is cost effective and peers are in a better position to monitor the situation and trends. This approach also increases the feasibility and sustainability of the project and direct involvement of the community will encourage their "ownership" of the project and potential response to the project activities among the network of substance users. In this manner, the concept of the program becomes a community based approach rather than an institutionalized one.

Through peer led intervention the aim is to reach children and early adolescents who are vulnerable children/ adolescents at the age group 10 – 18 who are non-users.

I would like to congratulate the Orissa Voluntary Health Associations on the publication of the 50th annual report and it's commendable contribution in making the children aware about the harmful effects of drugs through the CPLI project at Puri, Odisha and thereby making the country 'drug free'.



It would help support the government and other agencies in formatting and implementing necessary health programmes in state. Introduction

OVHA at a Glance

Orissa Voluntary Health Association (OVHA) is a State Chapter of Voluntary Health Association of India (VHAI) and is a network of leading NGO's of Odisha came into existence in 1974. To meet the health needs of the people and to enhance their role in development OVHA that strives to engage in health, inclusive growth and sustainable developmental activities to fulfil its vision of "Making Health and Development a Reality for the People of Odisha" by ensuring active participation and involvement of service seekers and service providers of the State. In its 50 years of long journey, OVHA took up several challenges to strengthen the voluntary health movement and to promote community health in the State of Odisha. The initial objective was to create a supporting and enabling environment for all. "Health for All" was the mission which advocates public health management. The public health sector was not able to reach out to the vast population despite an intensive service delivery system. So a supporting organization was required which would help creation of demand for health care services and also facilitate the government to implement the same.

Today, the organization works not only in the field of community health and development but also rural and urban sanitation, child rights/ development, policy advocacy, Drug abuse substances, strategic research and helps the grassroots level voluntary organizations to plan, implement and evaluate their developmental programs. From Health to Community Health, Community Health to Women and Child health, Women & Child Health to Women's & Child's rights, whatever terms used from time to time, the focus always remained over Women & Children with special emphasis on weaker, marginalized, vulnerable section of the Society. Majority of OVHA's interventions are at the difficult and needy rural periphery in the hilly terrains and tribal dominated areas of the State.

Legal Status & Financial Management

OVHA is registered under the Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860 & Foreign Contribution Regulation Act (FCRA) 1976. The Organization has also registered under 12 A & 80 G of the Income Tax Act, EFF, TDS. TDS is deducted as per the Income Tax Rules. Income Tax is filed every year and FC - 6 Return is submitted to the Home Ministry every year. Audited Utilization Certificate is sent to the donor agency as per its requirement.

OVHA is a registered non-profit making society having a secular constitution which aims at improving the health of the people irrespective of caste, creed, sex and religion. It is a state level federation of 159 voluntary organizations engaged in health and developmental activities.

Presence in the State

OVHA has its presence in all the 30 Districts of the State directly or indirectly through its member organizations working in the field of Health & Development and through various projects in different geographical areas of Odisha.

Infrastructure

The state office of OVHA is located at Bhubaneswar. The Project Offices are there in remote and hard to reach areas in Kalahandi, Kandhamal, Khorda and Puri district in Odisha.

Management

OVHA is governed by 11 member's team elected by the General Body, known as the Governing Body of the Association. All the affairs related to the policy decision are vested to the Governing Body of OVHA, meets 4 times in a year.

The Executive Director of OVHA is responsible for execution of all the affairs and activities including day-to-day administration. He is also an Ex-officio member of the Governing Body.

OVHA Team

OVHA has a core group of professionals of various fields such as Doctors, Social Workers, Trainers, Managers and Supportive Staff. These experts of various fields are rendering their services (full time as well as part time) to achieve the desired goal of the organization. OVHA has a well-defined personal policy. The staff working in OVHA has a long experience varying from 2 to 30 years, in the field of Health & Development.

Structure of Ovha

OVHA has four types of members- organisation members, life members, associate members and Honourary Members. Together they form the General Body - the highest decision making body of the organisation. The General Body members are eligible to cast their vote as secret ballot to elect 11 Governing Body members. The Executive Director is an Ex-Officio member of the GB. The Governing Body elects the office bearers and looks after the activities of OVHA, which is executed by the Executive Director. Executive Director is one of the key persons of the organisation and establish link between management and staff.

Membership

OVHA has four types of members- organisation members, life members, associate members and Honourary Members. A structured application form has been developed in due consultation with its members for membership of OVHA. After proper scrutiny of the documents and field appraisal, the Governing Body recommends the name of the applicant organisations to General Body for induction in to OVHA as a member. In case of Associate members, individuals of reputation and expertise in the field of health and development are inducted as associate member of OVHA. The Annual membership fee is Rs.200/- for both categories. However, organisation members those who have completed three successful years of membership can also become Life Member by paying Rs.5,000/- only, which will be enhanced toRs. 7000/- from the FY 2024-25.

Networking, Liaisoning and Partnership Development

OVHA as a network is basically an institutional frame work and is to disseminate knowledge and information to enhance empowerment and to influence decision makers and development agencies at various levels. Also, networking is believed to strengthen NGO's ability to speak with one voice and to significantly increase their impact as policy negotiators and advocating agencies.

OVHA has successfully enhanced public health at the grass root, sub district, district and state level. OVHA collaborates with a number of distinguished international & national agencies.

Major activities-Primary Health Care

Chapter-I

Management of PHC (N) Under Public-Private Partnership (PPP)

Public private partnership (PPP) has emerged as one of the important strategies for health sector reform in Odisha. Initiatives have been taken by National Rural Health Mission, Health and Family Welfare Department,

Government of Odisha to undertake different PPPs in meeting the growing needs for health services and other national health programmes. With the support of the State Government, OVHA is managing 04 numbers of PHC (N). One is in Kalahandi district at Adri in Thuamul Rampur block and the rest are in Kandhamal district - PHC (N) Judabali in Kotagarh block , PHC (N) Mardipanka in Daringbadi Block and Bilabadi PHC(N) in Khajuripada block .Primary health care is a whole-of-society approach to health and well-being, centered on the needs and preferences of individuals, families and communities in large. It addresses the broader determinants of health and focuses on the comprehensive and interrelated aspects of physical, mental and social health and wellbeing. The Alma-Ata definition of Primary Health Care that emphasizes the principles of social justice, equity, self-reliance, appropriate technology, decentralization, community involvement, inter sectoral collaboration, and affordable cost. OVHA embraces this model of comprehensive primary healthcare for all.

Broad Objectives:

- ◆ Provide curative, preventive and promotive services at the PHCs.
- ◆ Participation in all the National Health Programmes.
- ◆ Strengthen referral services for secondary health care centres such as SDHs and District Headquarters Hospital.
- ◆ Promote comprehensive client centered integrated Public Health Communication strategy.
- ◆ Encouraging institutional services for pregnant women, family planning, sterilization etc.

Modalities:

- (i) Maintenance of PHC (N) building and physical infrastructure, equipment, furniture and records etc.
- (ii) Delivery of all the clinical services and other Public Healthcare services, as normally expected from any Primary Health Centre.
- (iii) Recruitment of medical/paramedical/other staff as per the sanctioned norm of PHC(N) for providing services.
- (iv) Submission of mandatory reports like HMIS, IDSP, and facility based MDR & CDR and other programme reports to Government.
- (v) In addition to Allopathic system of medicine, provision of AYUSH medicine.
- (vi) In order to ensure quality of care, efforts has been made to equip these PHC (N)s as per NQAS (National Quality Assurance Standards) and standards stipulated in 'Kayakalapa'.
- (vii) All services were provided in free of cost to the patients at the hospital. No charges has been collected from patients for availing of any diagnostic test, treatments, drugs, and registration on OP & IP etc.
- (viii) The existing Rogi Kalyan Samiti (RKS) at the level of PHC has been reformed as Jana Arogya Samiti (JAS).
- (ix) In order to ensure patients' satisfaction, effective grievance redressal mechanism and regular patient satisfaction survey has been established and same was reviewed by the respective Jana Arogya Samiti (JAS).

The following services were provided on a 24x7 basis at PHC level.

General OPD Service

Services provided in OPD are; Diagnosis and screening of patients attending Allopathic OPD and AYUSH OPD, prescription of free drugs, referral of complicated cases. In case of emergency, the PHC Staff attended the patient even it is beyond the general working hour.

Care in pregnancy and childbirth

- ◆ Early registration of pregnancy and Antenatal check-up.

- ◆ Identifying HRP, GDM
- ◆ Normal Vaginal delivery & pre referral management in case of emergencies.

Neonatal and infant health care services

- ◆ Identification and management of high risk newborn
- ◆ Management of BA, ARI, Diarrhea
- ◆ Identification & referral for congenital anomalies and AEFI
- ◆ Complete Immunization, Vitamin. A Supplementation

Childhood & adolescent health care services

- ◆ Identification and management of vaccine preventable diseases
- ◆ Early detection & referral for abnormalities, delay and disability
- ◆ Prompt Management of ARI, acute Diarrhea and detection of SAM
- ◆ Adolescent Health counseling.

Family planning & other reproductive health care services

- ◆ Provision of condoms, OCP, ECP and insertion & removal of IUCD
- ◆ Counseling and facilitation for safe abortion services and Post abortion contraceptive counseling
- ◆ Identification and management of RTIs/STIs

Management of communicable diseases including NHP

- ◆ Sensitization and education session for different stakeholders on prevention and control of communicable diseases at the community level.
- ◆ Education session for school students on Cause, clinical features, preventive measures for communicable diseases.

Management of Common communicable diseases and acute / simple illnesses

- ◆ Treatment and management of fever cases
- ◆ Screening and treatment of anemia cases with counseling service.
- ◆ Treatment and management of Nausea and Vomiting cases.
- ◆ Treatment and preventive measures for diarrhea cases.

Screening & comprehensive management of NCDs

- ◆ Screening of NCD cases at the community level with support from ASHA and AWW
- ◆ Treatment, Counseling and follow up of NCD cases
- ◆ Community awareness on prevention and management of NCD cases

Health Promotion / Wellness activities

- ◆ Education session on hygiene and sanitation at the community level.
- ◆ Promotion of Yoga and physical exercise.
- ◆ Sensitization program at the community level on need and importance of Millets for a healthier life.
- ◆ Promotion of kitchen garden and nutritional garden at the community level.

PHC (N) ADRI, Kalahandi

The OPD is functioning 24x7 hours with alternative support of the Allopathic doctor, Ayurvedic doctor and other paramedics. Every day more than 40 patients from nearby villages are visiting to this health unit for treatment. We also refer serious patients to CHC Th.Rampur and DHH, Bhawanipatna.

PHC (N) JUDABALI, KANDHAMAL

With the support of state Government OVHA started working in the PHC (N) Judabali of Kotagarh block of Kandhamal district since December 2015.

The OPD is functioning 24x7 hours with alternative support of the Allopathic doctor, Ayurvedic doctor and other paramedics. Every day more than 55 patients from nearby villages are visiting to this health unit for treatment. Apart from OPD services community sensitization programme on prevention of communicable diseases and non-communicable diseases were organised at the community level.

Community Awareness on communicable diseases like Malaria, TB and Dengue along with NCDs was done through:

1. Small group meetings ((10-15 people) were organized at community level such as Anganwadi centres, community halls, religious places etc.
2. Door-to-door sensitization through ASHA, AWW and community volunteers.
3. Sensitization meetings (one-one meeting) with Community leaders, self-groups, patient support groups, women groups, Village Health and Sanitation Committee etc.
4. Mass meeting with support from PRI members and community leaders.

URBAN MOBILE HEALTH UNIT

The National Urban Health Mission (NUHM) seeks to improve the health status of the urban population particularly of the poor and disadvantaged segment of population by facilitating equitable access to quality health care through a revamped public health system and community-based mechanism with the active involvement of the urban local bodies. In consideration with the urban poor and disadvantaged section of the community, it is increasingly realized that a sizeable percentage of population do not reside in slums but stay in temporary settlements.

Similarly, the urban poor living in slums or slum like conditions especially the most vulnerable groups are exposed to wide array of diseases. Lack of access to health care delivery points backed by low health/treatment seeking behavior compound the plight of the poor and they are deprived of health facilities provisioned for them and in turn the incidence of preventable diseases and deaths rises alarmingly.

Hence, To address the health issues of the vulnerable groups, especially the mobile population by providing preventive, primitives and curative health care services at their doorsteps on routine manner and thereby creating an enabling environment through awareness generation for improved health seeking behavior towards public health, one Mobile Health Unit (MHU) is running since 15th December 2015 in the slums of Bhubaneswar by OVHA with the support of National Urban Health Mission (NUHM). It covers around one lakh population.

OVHA have undertaken various health and hygiene initiatives in order to provide services to the underprivileged sections of society. The intention behind this initiative was to provide free medical check-ups, medication and healthcare facilities at doorstep to the larger community who do not have access to good quality medical support. The mobile medical van have been providing free discourse for more than 5 years and reached out to lakhs of underprivileged people in Bhubaneswar Slum. While normal health services for basic illnesses like cough, cold, fever, infections, malaria etc are provided by the Van. Through the mobile medical Van, OVHA also identifies the most widespread disease as per the season and provides a road map for the cause accordingly. These visits also served as an educational platform for the society where citizens are taught about the Do's and Don'ts to maintain proper and better hygiene, with a focus on preventive health.

Objective:

The objective of the MHU is to address the health issues of the vulnerable groups, especially the mobile population by providing preventive, primitives and curative health care services at their doorsteps on routine manner and thereby creating an enabling environment through awareness generation for improved health seeking behavior towards public health.

Operational modalities & services provided through MHU:

The Urban MHU has managed by OVHA in PPP mode with support from NHM, Odisha.

Two sessions (Morning & afternoon/evening) has conducted in providing services to the identified population group.

(a) Consultation, Screening & Referral General services

- ◆ Consultation and treatment of common ailments & referral of complicated cases wherever required.

- ◆ Early detection of suspected TB, Malaria, Leprosy, along with referral for confirm sick and other locally endemic communicable diseases and non-communicable diseases such as hypertension, diabetes and cataract cases etc.
- ◆ Distribution of essential drugs

(b) RMNCH + A Services

- ◆ Ante-Natal checkup and related services e.g. injection - tetanus toxoid, iron and folic acid tablets, basic laboratory tests such as hemoglobin, urine for sugar and albumin and referral for other tests as required
- ◆ Referral for complicated pregnancies
- ◆ Promotion of institutional delivery
- ◆ Post-natal checkup
- ◆ Treatment of common childhood illness such as diarrhea, ARI/Pneumonia, complication of measles etc.
- ◆ Treatment of RTI/STI
- ◆ Adolescents care such as lifestyle education, counseling, treatment of minor ailments and anemia etc.
- ◆ Use of PTK for pregnancy detection
- ◆ Detection & referral of SAM

(c) Family Planning Services

- ◆ Counseling for spacing and permanent method
- ◆ Distribution of Nirodh, oral contraceptives, emergency contraceptives
- ◆ Counseling for CAC/safe abortion services

(d) Non Communicable Disease (NCD)

- ◆ Blood pressure examination
- ◆ Blood sugar examination for detection of diabetes cases/blood sugar monitoring for under treatment cases
- ◆ Health education/IEC and awareness on cervical, breast and oral cancer.
- ◆ BMI- Measurement of height and weight, over weight/obesity
- ◆ Patient counseling for LSM for all population/specially people diabetes, HIN, obesity, tobacco and alcohol users. o Referral of all cases of having visual, hearing an mental problems to DHQ/Capital hospital/tertiary institutions

(e) Disease Control Program

- ◆ Early detection of suspected TB, Malaria, Dengue, leprosy cases and referral to higher institutions

(f) Diagnostic

- ◆ Investigation facilities like Blood sugar, hemoglobin, urine examination, blood pressure, PTK
- ◆ Screening of breast cancer, cervical cancer & oral etc.
- ◆ Smear for malaria/RDK.
- ◆ Clinical detection of leprosy, tuberculosis and locally endemic diseases

(g) IEC/BCC and Counseling

- ◆ Material on health including RMNCH +A, personal hygiene, proper nutrition, use of tobacco, Non communicable Disease and Diseases Control Program, PNDT Act, RT/STI, HIV/AIDS, IYCF shall be used for public awareness.
- ◆ Counseling sessions in the sites on various themes.

CPLI PROJECT



Community based Peer Led Intervention Project- Funded by NISD, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment Substance use is a major public health problem that in particular, puts millions of adolescents at a variety of risks that include increased risk for traffic accidents, high risk sexual practices, juvenile delinquency, family problems and developmental problems.

Children and adolescents living in the street, slums and homeless, become particularly vulnerable to substance use in such high risk circumstances. Also, the rate of help seeking behaviour is low due to many factors like lack of family and community support compared to others. It is always better to intervene before they initiate the substance use behaviour. Ensuring active participation of young people, they may be empowered to prevent and disseminate information on substance use prevention. Also for this, there should be a strategy where young people learn from each other and support themselves. For this purpose, under the scheme of Targeted Intervention, OVHA has implemented Community Based peer Led Intervention (CPLI) in Puri district with support from Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Govt of India for preventing and reducing the substance use among the young people. Through peer led intervention the aim is to reach children and early adolescents who are: ·Vulnerable children/ adolescents at the age group 10 - 18 who are non users.

Objectives of the Programme:

- a) To assess substance use among adolescents in impoverished & marginalized communities
- b) Conduct primary prevention activities through awareness programs
- c) Engage in risk mitigation of substance use among children/ adolescent/youth by: ·Preventing substance use
·Delaying initiation of substance use
- d) Identify and train selected peer educators in the community Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment Government of India
- e) Implement early prevention education led by trained peer educators

- f) To provide awareness about referral and linkage to counselling, treatment and rehabilitation services for substance dependent adolescents identified in the community
- g) Identifying adolescents subjected to substance use and facilitating their referral/ admission into Rehabilitation Centres / Drop In Centres.

Program Activities:

- a) Outreach activities in the community among vulnerable children and adolescents
- b) Community Mapping and Assessment.
- c) Identification and Training of adolescents as Peer Educators to lead Peer led community intervention.
- d) Life skill sessions: particularly designed for prevention of substance use in communities by selected and trained Peer Educators
- e) Providing psychosocial therapies
- f) Follow-up care including family counselling
- g) IEC distribution for awareness
- h) Referred to referral unit for leave substance
- l) Implementation of Mission Life
- k) Nasha Mukh Bharat Abhiyaan (NMBA)





SUB CENTER HWC AT KHORDHA DISTRICT



With the support of state Government OVHA started working in 02 no's of Sub centre in Khordha district . One is Nairi in Balugaon block and Badapokharia in Tangi Block from June 2023.

COMMUNITY PROCESS ACTIVITIES

OVHA has organized 07 batches of two days field level MAS training with the support of National Health Mission (NHM) . In that training program where 250 office bearers of MAS like President, Secretary , Treasurer attended the training programme. In that Training session the Resource person training about :

- ◆ Functioning of Anganwadi with better implementation of activities and schemes under relevant programme.
- ◆ Expediting measures and supporting interventions for no malnourished children in the area, especially promoting proper nutrition, health, and hygiene of pregnant and lactating women.

- ◆ Facilitating regular VHND and all outreach services (both special and routine) by ANM.
- ◆ Very significant improvement in institutional deliveries with no home deliveries.
- ◆ Availability of referral transport, ensuring referrals of all required cases of health and wellness.
- ◆ Availability of all necessary drugs with ASHA as per guideline with proper storage of them.
- ◆ Adequate use of mosquito nets by all the community members adopting measures to control mosquito's and other vectors to do away with malaria, dengue, and vector-borne diseases.
- ◆ Prompt diagnosis, treatment, and referral of all fever cases, with no malaria, dengue, and vector-borne diseases.
- ◆ Initiating measures in controlling the cases of diarrhea with adequate awareness.
- ◆ Functional schools with mid-day-meal scheme and implementing activities under RBSK and RKSK.

Monitor the situation of water, sanitation, food, housing and education services in your area.

- ◆ Arrange a monthly and quarterly meeting with all relevant stakeholders to discuss the community issues and devise a convergence plan. Coordinate with ANM and Anganwadi worker and supervisor to arrange a meeting with the stakeholders.
- ◆ Seek support for the use of community structures like municipal community centers for education sessions and promotion of behaviors related to health and health determinants.
- ◆ Utilize the provisions under various government development schemes to advocate with the local authorities for construction of community based health centres, community toilets, water drains, sewerage, drainage and disposal system in the area.
