

CHAPTER I

HEALTH OF URBAN POOR

The city Demonstration Programme, HUP is implemented by OVHA from October-2011 with the support of USAID through PFI. A team of 15 staffs have been engaged for the smooth implementation of the Project including 2 project coordinators, 11 cluster coordinators, 1 accountant and 1 data entry operator.

Vision:

“A responsive, functional and sustainable health system that provides need based affordable and accessible quality health care, improved water, sanitation and hygiene for urban poor in eight states.

Goal:

“To improve the health status of urban poor by adopting effective, efficient and sustainable strategic intervention approaches, adopting the principle of convergence of the various development programmes.

Objectives:

- ◆ Provide quality technical assistance to the GOI, states and cities for effective implementation of the proposed National Urban Health Mission (NRHM) or ongoing Urban Health Component of the NRHM
- ◆ Expand partnership in Urban health including engaging the commercial sector in PPP activities
- ◆ Promote the convergence of different GOI urban health and development efforts.
- ◆ Strengthen urban planning initiatives by the state through evidence based city level demonstration and learning efforts

Area of Intervention and Population covered

- ◆ Among all the Partner Organisations of PFI under Health for Urban Poor (HUP) Project our OVHA is working in maximum number of slums i.e. 42 slums including 16 slums from UHC areas and 26 slums from non UHC areas
- ◆ Total 50000 populations and 10000 house hold covered

Activities implemented

Field visit-Every month field visit are done by the PC and CCs to track the pregnant women, lactating women, 0-1 yrs child and eligible couple of age between 15-49.

Capacity Building- 42 Mahila Arogya Samiti (MAS) have been formed in 42 slums& each MAS is formed by a group of 10-15 nos of women of the same slum.

Event celebration-In order to mobilize community on health and hygiene issue Children's Day, school health programmes, World Health Day and World water day; Magic shows,street plays, etc. were being organized in different slums.

Establish linkages- Organized health camp in collaboration with Family Planning Association of India in




different slums in non UHC area in order to provide medical facility to the slum people on regular basis.

Sanitary Survey : Conducted in all 42 slums

Achievement so far

- ◆ Throughout the year 6878 eligible couple have been tracked and encouraged to adopt modern contra septic major for birth spacing.
- ◆ 1389 lactating and pregnant mothers were tracked and counseled on regular immunization, benefits of immunization, exclusive breast feeding ,complimentary feeding colostrums feeding , about THR and health and hygiene.
- ◆ Every month MAS members were trained on different health and hygiene issue. Now these members are actively involved in community mobilization on health and hygiene issue.
- ◆ The health seeking behavior and awareness on health and hygiene issues are improved by people of the slum after the intervention of HUP program implemented by OVHA.
- ◆ Two Ward coordination committees have been formed in ward no 7 and 15 to keep coordination between the government agency and slum people.
- ◆ H₂S test has been carried out around 500 water sources



CHAPTER II

POOREST AREAS CIVIL SOCIETY PROGRAMME

Poorest Areas Civil Society (PACS) Programme envisages contributing towards the millennium development goal of poverty reduction world over by 2015, by working through civil society organizations in India on issues of governance, empowerment and entitlements of the poor.

The project aims to strengthen civil society organizations to work as effective catalysts, implementation agencies and nodal points for the convergence of backward and forward linkages to ensure the success of various anti-poverty programmes.



Achievements

- ◆ 187 Drop out girls brought back to schools from 29 villages.
- ◆ Untouchability has remarkably reduced; hand pump use is now open to all without discrimination
- ◆ Children of SC and ST taking midday meal with other children and general caste children eating food cooked by Dalit women,
- ◆ In 60 numbers of monthly review meeting the progress of the project activities have been discussed and also forthcoming planning have been finalized
- ◆ 120 Community Based Monitoring Tools are being placed and filled up by the Partner NGOs
- ◆ 150 capacity building training programmes have been organised for the proper functioning of GKS. They are active and meeting regularly
- ◆ 105 numbers of SHGs are active and functioning properly
- ◆ 5 numbers of training organised on monitoring of health facilities
- ◆ 10 Block level interface organised for service providers and PRIs
- ◆ 5 Media Advocacy programmes organised
- ◆ One annual reflection and planning meeting of network partners conducted
- ◆ One annual service delivery assessment had been organised
- ◆ 25 village information centers are functional



CHAPTER III

MALARIA PROGRAMME

Malaria is one of the major diseases undermining the health of vulnerable communities in the state. Malaria Programme of OVHA is a VHAI supported World Bank Project.

Aims:

To provide effective services to plan and implement social mobilization and delivery of timely and appropriate preventive and curative services for malaria control in identified endemic areas.

Objectives:

- ◆ Strengthening the national control programme through capacity building of health volunteers, peripheral health workers, getting real time feedback on services and logistics from affected communities
- ◆ Mobilizing community members on the use of LLINs and acceptance of IRS
- ◆ Advocating with different groups to gain political commitment and cooperation for malaria control amongst vulnerable communities
- ◆ Integrate malaria control with other health and development programmes

Area of Intervention:

- ◆ The Project covers 11 districts in general and two districts i.e., Rayagada (Kashipur Block) and Malkangiri (Kudmulguma Block) in particular with intensive programmes

Achievements

- ◆ Village meetings among villagers including PRI members, school children, Nayaks, Disharis, mothers, etc regarding malaria on regular basis
- ◆ Monthly staff meeting is being carried out to discuss monthly progress and to chalk out action plan for the coming month
- ◆ Training of ASHAs
- ◆ Involvement in other National health Programmes



CHAPTER IV

SMILE-TWIN-e-LEARNING PROJECT

Objective:

Changing lives of urban-poor (adolescent youths) who belong to under privileged category of the society. OVHA has taken the opportunity to work with the youths who are educated up to +2 and extended support to them so that they can continue their education. This scope brings smile on the face of the youths once more. They are given the required education as per need of time like computer, spoken English, basic management, retail management and other education on HIV/AIDS. This type of education has not only helped the youths to get jobs but also improved their capacity for negotiation.

Target groups:

- ◆ Any urban disadvantaged youth (under the age of 21 and over 14) with either formal or non-formal education providing that they have to pass the interview test
- ◆ This includes especially women in reproductive age group, adolescents (girls & boys) of the general population.




CHAPTER V URBAN NGO SCHEME


In Bhubaneswar city , OVHA was appointed as Urban NGO (UNGO) covering a population of 25,000 approximately in Ward No 9,11 & 15.OVHA has a OPD in Panda Park Basti of Harekrushna Nagar. This programme is being run with the support of NRHM to bring health awareness in the community and in advocacy mode with the service providers to render effective services.

CHAPTER VI SURAKHYA

UNICEF & OVHA in partnership with the Govt. of ODISHA has launched the Infant and young Child Feeding Practice (IYCF) initiative in the entire state (all the 314 CD blocks) as project SURAKHYA on 22nd June 2011.

Aim: The aim of Project Surakhya is to improve the Infant and Young child feeding practice in Odisha, thereby curbing down the infant and under five mortality and morbidity rates.

Activities:



Coverage:

At the end of the project total 81220 beneficiaries have been oriented through various activities of project Surakhya, which includes Frontline functionaries, Govt. Officials, Private medical practitioners, Panchayatraj members, mother support groups, SHGs, Pregnant and lactating mothers, community based Organizations and Local Ngo's. Also 9616 villages were covered in seven intense districts by organizing various IEC activities focusing on IYCF practices

LEGAL AWARENESS CAMP


